plans to attend Case Western Reserve University to major in Biomedical Engineering. He was a member of National Honor Society, Orchestra (President/

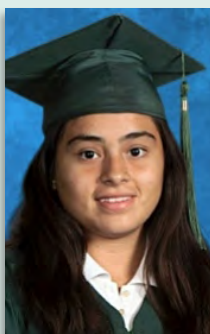

She thanked everyone who helped her classmates throughout their academic journey, including teachers, principals, BHS guidance counselor Doug Dressman, and mostly parents. "Thank you (parents) for supporting us in more ways than it's logically possible... Thank you for waking us up and in some cases dragging us to school. Thank you for showing up to our concerts, games, award shows... You helped us with homework, listened to our good and bad, and paid for our school fees. You support us, love us, comfort us, and so much more. You are the driving force of our success."

Rachel said that all the classmates may not know each other, but they all had one thing in common... They all passed Algebra II. She explained that everything they learned in Algebra II was focused around two central concepts—constants and variables, and this is the same for life. "From our backgrounds and home lives, to our attitudes and desires, we are engulfed in each other's differences—our variables. But one thing remains the same: us," Rachel said. "Our ability to achieve and exceed the expectations set by those around us. There is something inside of you, right now, that separates you from those who are not here. THAT is your constant. It helps you thrive, whether you're on top of the world or barely scraping by. You're here because of you, the choices you made, the people you chose to listen to, the actions you express each day... I urge you to continue on this path of success and determination, wherever it takes you."

Superintendent's Message

- 6) Accountable, responsible and transparent management of district finances and resources.

As I realized that the four goals I had previously set for the district were all incorporated within the strategic plan; we are now officially adopting the strategic planning goals as our six major goals. We will continue our relentless pursuit to educate our

students from preschool through high school to the best of our abilities. We believe our strategic plan will help guide us to success. You can find a copy of our plan on our website.

I would like to take a moment to thank the staff, students, parents, and community members for helping our students become successful in school and in life. I never fully grasped the concept of "it takes a village to raise a child" until I came to the Bedford Schools. I am so appreciative of the number of ways that community, clergy, city officials, and parents wrap their arms around our children in the interest of making them better citizens, students, and goodwill ambassadors. Did You Know?

The following interesting facts about some of the Bedford High School Class of 2017's achievements were taken from BHS Principal Samuel J. Vawters' 2017 *Did You Know* commencement address:

- Did you know that we have a young man who has traveled extensively with both our University Bound Scholars and DECA? He's been out of the country and on 15 different college campuses throughout the Midwest and east coast. He has maintained a 3.8 accumulative GPA and was awarded an academic scholarship of more than \$100,000 to attend Miami University – **Mr. Kameron Turner.**
- Did you know that we have a young lady who is a classically trained pianist? She has volunteered inside and outside of her community with over 500 hours in volunteer work and community service. She is part of our Supes Troops. She's been awarded more than \$10,000 a year to attend The Ohio State University this fall, majoring in Criminal Justice and Political Science, to become a defense attorney – **Ms. India Crawford.**
- Did you know that one of our own will be a neurologist one day? He just finished his Senior Project in urology at the Cleveland Clinic and also participated in the Charles R. Drew Saturday Academy, where he explored medicine. We are proud to say that he will study at one of the top Neuroscience programs in the country at The Ohio State University. He has earned nearly \$90,000 in scholarships – **Mr. Maurice Ward.**
- Did you know that we have an Ambassador? This next young lady has traveled abroad to such countries as Italy, Greece, France and Germany... She participated in the People to People Euro Odyssey Ambassadors program – **Ms. Etienne Forté.**
- Did you know that we have a Student Master Technician at Bedford High School? We have a student who has achieved the level of Master Technician in our automotive technology program. He has passed 9 ASE (Automotive Service Excellence) tests in order to achieve this title - the first BHS student in many years to do so – **Mr. Austin Tokarcik.**
- Did you know that we have two young men who have received academic and athletic scholarships, each receiving over \$25,000 a year? They will both be attending West Virginia Wesleyan University this fall to play football – **Mr. Deanjelious Brown** and **Mr. Tishuan Gunter.**
- Did you know that we have a concertmaster and principal violinist? This young man was a student participant in the Cleveland Clinic's Charles R. Drew Academy. He is a future biomedical engineer, and as I shared earlier, he is also a concertmaster and principal violinist in two different orchestras: Bedford High School's Orchestra and the Tri-C Orchestra. He has taken such classes as AP Chemistry, AP Calculus, AP Literature, AP Physics and AP Statistics. He is ranked 3rd in his class with a 3.89 accumulative GPA, and he will be attending Case Western Reserve University this fall – **Mr. Justin Satchel.**
- Did you know that our class valedictorian has been offered a total of \$346,952 in scholarships and aid? She has accepted an academic scholarship to the Honors College at the University of Akron worth about \$40,000 and will graduate debt free. We are proud to introduce to you – **Ms. Rachel Madigan.**
- Did you know that our class officers are the first in many years, maybe the first ever, to self-fund their after-prom? These young ladies are also the first to petition the Superintendent and Board of Education to orchestrate a completely student-centered and student-led commencement ceremony. What you will see tonight is our students—your babies and my babies—facilitate and orchestrate this year's commencement ceremony. These young ladies will deliver the commencement speech; and they will also announce the students' names to receive their diplomas, which has never been done in Bedford High School commencement ceremony history...EVER – **Ms. Lauren Morgan** (president), **Ms. Katie Kennedy** (vice-president), **Ms. Sophia McDaniel** (secretary) and **Ms. Gabby White** (treasurer).

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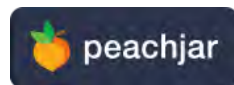
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Glendale Students Shine at Statewide Speech Contest
